Blind, Deaf, and Numb

Helen Keller lived from 1880 to 1968. When she was 19 months old, an illness robbed her of her ability to see and hear. She learned to "hear" other people by using her fingers to feel the lips and throat of the speaker. She learned to speak and write because of her ability to interact with her world through touch. She became the first deafblind person in the United States to earn a Bachelor of Arts degree. She wrote 12 published books and several articles. She also gave numerous speeches throughout her life. Helen Keller's ability to feel the world around her, even though she was deaf and blind, made all the difference for her.

But imagine how her life would have been different if she was blind, deaf, and numb. Imagine being unable to see, hear, and feel. At that point, one would be hardly able to interact with the world around them.

The Bible presents the idea of being spiritually blind, deaf, and numb. When Jesus' disciples asked Him why he taught in parables, His reply was, "Therefore I speak to them in parables, because seeing they do not see, and hearing they do not hear, nor do they understand" (Matt. 13:13). Many in Jesus' audience had ears to hear and eyes to see. However, they could not see, hear, or understand what Jesus was saying because "Their ears are hard of hearing and their eyes they have closed" (Matt. 13:15). Jesus is saying that many in His audience are spiritually blind and deaf, and nothing that Jesus could say to them would get through to them. Parables served as a kind of moral test that Jesus used. Those genuinely interested in Jesus and His ministry would see He is the Christ; however, those blinded by prejudice and doubt could not see Jesus for who He is.

In Ephesians 4:17-19, Paul presents the spiritual condition of some. He notes that they walk in the "futility of their mind," and their "understanding is darkened." He also notes that they suffer from "the blindness of their heart" and are "past feeling." They were not only spiritually blind but spiritually numb. In I Timothy 4:2, the Apostle Paul discusses those who have "their own conscience seared with a hot iron." We understand that skin that is burned enough eventually becomes numb.

Being spiritually blind, deaf, and numb is not a state we want to be in. Jesus can heal us of this spiritual sickness if we turn to Him. Jesus told the church at Laodicea, which had become lukewarm, to "buy from Me gold refined in the fire, that you may be rich; and white garments, that you may be clothed, that the shame of your nakedness may not be revealed; and anoint your eyes with eye salve, that you may see" (Rev. 3:18). The first step to being cured of any spiritual sickness is to realize that Jesus has the cure and that we are incomplete without Him. It is through Jesus that we can have a new life. He has the cure! —Jason P. Smith
